SALUTE TO FLAG

Supervisor Croce opened the meeting with a salute to the American Flag.

ROLL CALL

PUBLIC HEARING – RENEWAL OF CABLEVISION FRANCHISE AGREEMENT

Supervisor Croce read the legal notice that was printed in the local Town Newspaper. He stated that he would be taking comments and questions this evening, however the Cablevision representative will not be joining us this evening. He stated that the Town Board will have to decide whether we want to renew the contract for 10-years or 15-years. If we renew for 10-years, we can receive a technology grant for \$14,500.00 and if we renew for 15-years we can receive the grant for \$29,000.00. The representative stated that the Town Board had to decide which grant we wanted so that the contract would be complete and ready for discussion at the Public Hearing. He stated that he would be leaving the Public Hearing open until the next meeting and the representative will be here at that meeting.

Councilwoman Delgado stated that she was going to ask the representative if there was some way to give the senior's a better Senior Package and/or a break in the price.

Supervisor Croce stated that he could give her the representative's phone number if she would like to call him to discuss this request.

Supervisor Croce stated that he had met with the Cablevision Representative a week or so ago and they spoke about obtaining a price estimate from Time Warner. He stated that Time Warner would not be able to use the Cablevision transmission lines in Town and it would be very expensive for Time Warner to come in and put new transmission lines in. He stated that much of the contract agreement is already decided by the FCC. We do receive a franchise fee of 7% and this is not something that the Town can request to change. If the FCC does decide to change it, then we will automatically receive whatever the amount is changed to. He stated that if someone does not want to use the Cablevision Company, then other choices would be companies like Direct TV and Dish Network.

Supervisor Croce explained that the technology grants that the Town could receive are for the Town to improve its technology in some form. The Cablevision Company is very lenient as to how it is used.

He stated that he was considering purchasing some equipment so that the Town Board Meetings could be broadcast live on a specific channel or we could purchase digital recording equipment to make CD's if anyone wanted to review a meeting. He stated that sometimes we have bad weather and people do not want to drive to the meetings. This way they could watch the meetings from home.

Mrs. Lynn Ridgeway questioned about the Library getting internet access free of charge. She noted in the agreement where cablevision was given to a number of places in Town. The internet service at the Library is one of the largest bills that they pay.

Supervisor Croce explained to everyone that Cablevision supplies free "cable" too many places in Town; the Town Hall, Fire Departments, the Elementary School, the Police Dept. and the Library. He stated that they can only supply "internet" to one place in Town and that is currently the Town Hall. He stated that he has already asked them to give us internet at the Town Park as we have a security system that runs off of the internet that we have to pay for every month. He stated that the representative said there is only one free internet service to the Town.

This lead to the Town Board and several residents discussing what is "Cable" and what is "Internet". The Library is already getting free cable. There was also discussion that you could call the Cablevision Company and discuss "bundling" of these features and maybe ask for a reduced fee.

Supervisor Croce stated that he would be keeping the Public Hearing open until the next Town Board Meeting on August 5<sup>th</sup>, but if anyone wanted to speak with the representative from Cablevision, he would give them the phone number to contact him.

Mrs. Coppola stated that she has some issues with the internet service in her area. She stated that she was told that she could not get certain stuff on her computer because there were no new lines down her road. When asked for specific items that she could not receive, she stated that she was not sure as she did not know the technical names for these things. She stated that she was just told that the options were not available to her at her location. She stated that she felt this company was like a monopoly and the Town should be able to have all the services throughout the Town. She stated that she felt the Town should be able to negotiate with them for better service for the seniors too. There is a senior package but it only gives you a few stations to watch. The squeaky wheel gets the oil! They need to negotiate with the Town or we will go someplace else.

Mr. Ridgeway asked the Town Board who owned the infrastructure for cable within the Town and what would happen to the lines if we were to use a different company?

Supervisor Croce stated that the current cable lines belong to Cablevision and if they were to leave the Town of Plattekill, he thought that they would probably remove most or all of them. According to the Cablevision representative, Time Warner would not be able to use the Cablevision lines.

Mrs. Coppola stated that it would cost them a lot to remove all their lines.

Councilman DePew stated that the infrastructure is owned by Cablevision and they probably have a contract with the people who own the poles. He stated that he would like to get FIOS at his house, but they have no lines in this part of Town. The FCC doesn't like the word monopoly and there are other choices out there. We have talked about getting more from this company, but this is what we can get. He suggested that everyone here this evening should come to the next meeting when the representative is here.

Mrs. Coppola stated that she would like to have this room packed to deal with this company at the next meeting. She would like to see the Town Board fight for its residents to get us a better deal.

Mr. Ridgeway stated that he would like to see if Time Warner would take the opportunity to come into Plattekill.

Supervisor Croce stated that this industry is regulated by the FCC and the Public Service Commission. It is not a monopoly.

Mrs. Coppola stated that even if we lose, we need to try something. When you have these big companies come in and they think we are nothing to them, they will try to tell us what to do.

Supervisor Croce stated that when he spoke to the representative, he did not get that feeling. He explained that the Town Board has to decide on whether to do a 10 year or a 15 year contract before we have a Public Hearing. That is why he is leaving the public hearing open until the next meeting.

Mrs. Figueroa asked if we had an offer from Time Warner? They might be competitive.

Mr. Ridgeway asked how we could make a decision without knowing what the other company would offer us?

Councilman Putnam stated that if we did not use Cablevision, they would have 6 months to remove their lines.

Councilman DePew stated that these companies also have commitments with the other utility companies for using the poles and other equipment.

There was no further discussion.

\* Supervisor Croce made a motion to hold open the Public Hearing on the Cablevision Franchise Agreement until the next regular Town Board Meeting on August 5, 2015 at 7:00 PM.

Councilman Farrelly seconded.

On the vote: all ayes.

### REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING

#### MINUTES

\* Supervisor Croce made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the July 1, 2015 Regular Town Board Meeting.

Councilwoman Delgado seconded.

On the vote: all ayes.

\* Supervisor Croce made a motion to accept the minutes from the July 1, 2015 Regular Town Board Meeting.

Councilman Farrelly seconded.

On the vote: all ayes.

#### ADDITIONS

Supervisor Croce stated that he had one addition for this evening's agenda. He stated that he has spoken with the Highway Superintendent about needing some additional electric work at the Park

Pavilion. When we setup for events there is a piece of plywood with outlets attached that we use to try to get electric to other areas of the Park. He stated that this set-up leaves us with wires and plugs that are not very safe.

Supervisor Croce stated that the suggestion is to have two locked cabinets, one on the southeast corner of the Pavilion and one on the northwest corner of the Pavilion. These boxes would have a heavy cord with a box on the end that would have 8 GFI outlets for vendors to plug into or to run additional lines down to the lower field.

Mr. Wager explained that the boxes are all pre-made and the design was done by Dominic Ferrante, the electrician who did the original electric design within the Pavilion. He stated that the way we had the electric set up was safe in the past, but our vendor base is growing and we need these extra outlets to accommodate the increase in usage.

Supervisor Croce stated that when the Modena Fire Dept. does the caroling for the Tree Lighting Ceremony, they have to use a generator for electric and the noise from that generator drowns out their voices. It will be much better to have electric available from the Pavilion.

There was discussion that this project would cost approximately \$3,500.00 and that there was money in the A7110.2 Park Equipment budget line to pay for this improvement.

\* Councilman DePew made a motion to allocate up to \$3,500.00, from the Parks Equipment Budget Line A7110.2, to update the electric at the Thomas Felten Park.

Councilwoman Delgado seconded.

On the vote: all ayes.

#### PUBLIC INPUT

Mrs. Esther Coppola stated that she felt the Fireworks were spectacular and she felt the Highway Dept. did a wonderful job setting up the designated areas and signage for the event. She stated that as long as they were talking about up-grading the electric, she would also like to suggest that they add some more speakers so that we can have music going with the fireworks and the music can be heard better up by the Pavilion.

Supervisor Croce thanked her for her comment and stated that he agreed the fireworks were great. He stated that he also felt her suggestion to up-grade the speaker system was a good idea; however it would be a totally different project from the electric.

There was some discussion on the fact that there are some dead spots where the music could not be heard on the middle level and up by the parking lot.

Mr. Wager stated that he would like to look into a stand-alone system with wireless speakers for improving the speaker system. He stated that he did not think it would be a good idea to run wires under the ground through the athletic/sport fields where the kids play.

The Town Board felt that this would be a good idea.

Mrs. Coppola stated that she was wondering if any decision had been made on doing anything to the Pavilion to relieve some of the concerns we have had in the past about the wind and rain coming in through the west side of the Pavilion? She stated that at one time there was talk about getting plastic panels or hanging shades from the edge of the Pavilion to try to cut down on the wind. She stated that

this would allow use of the Pavilion more into the fall or in the early spring. She stated that there was also talk about having movies at the Park and other summer activities. Has any of this been discussed recently?

Supervisor Croce stated that Mr. Harris had attempted to have movies and music in the Park, but he did not get much attendance to these events. As far as the wind, there was discussion but they have not done anything as yet. The issue he sees is that we have to shut off the water because there is no heat at the Pavilion as it gets into the fall season. He stated that the wind is an issue and the Camp Director has gone as far as using the elementary school for one day a week for Summer Camp so that the children can do paper crafts without having to worry about the paper blowing all over the Park.

Mrs. Coppola stated that she knows there is a collapsible screen that can be put up and taken down easily and it is not very costly. She stated that they are doing this in New Paltz.

Supervisor Croce thanked her for her comments.

Mrs. Pearl Morse stated that she agreed the Fireworks were great and everyone seemed to enjoy them.

Mrs. Morse stated that she also wanted to speak to the Town Board about Mr. O'Brien's letter to the editor that was in this week's newspaper. She stated that Mr. O'Brien keeps attacking our Veterans Committee and she would like to have the Town Board's permission to write a letter back to him, in the newspaper, explaining all the facts about the Committee and the Veteran's Memorial.

The Town Board discussed whether she should write a "letter to the editor" or try to contact a representative from the newspaper to put in an article about the Veterans Committee. There was a concern that letters to the editor are sometimes edited by the newspaper and this could happen to her letter.

Mrs. Morse stated that she would prefer to write a letter to the editor, just stating the true facts about the work that the Committee does and about the building plan for the Memorial. She stated that she would let the Town Board read it before sending it in. She stated that it was not fair to all those people who have donated their time, energy and money to be a part of the Veteran's Committee. She stated that they have also taken over the set-up of the Memorial Day Parade and they put on the entire event with only \$500.00. She stated that most people are not aware that she, Supervisor Croce and Loraine Morano went to Senator Larkin's office to discuss grants for the Memorial. Mr. O'Brien and other people need to know the facts and how hard people are working on all these things. It is a disservice to our Veterans that he continues to attack what we are working to do.

Councilwoman Delgado asked Mrs. Morse what she was going to write?

Mrs. Morse stated that she was just going to list the facts; the history of the Committee. She stated that she will let the Town Board read it before putting it in the newspaper and she will write it as being written by the Chairperson of the Veteran's Committee.

Supervisor Croce stated that he did not see a problem with doing it this way.

Councilwoman Delgado stated that she also agreed to allow her to write the letter.

Councilman DePew stated that he agreed also; the facts need to get out to the public.

Mrs. Morse stated that she also wanted to thank Mr. Wager for installing the Flag Box by the front door of the Town Hall. She stated that the Laskowsky's donated the old mail box and two boy scouts painted it. Then Sign Designs donated the lettering and the seal.

Supervisor Croce stated that he wanted to do something on the website to make sure everyone knows that it is there for their use. He stated that he also wanted to include the names of all those involved with this project, but he wants to get permission first, to put their names on the website.

Mrs. Morse explained how the mail box was donated, sand blasted by Mr. Wager, painted by two boy scouts from two different troops, lettered by Sign Designs and finally installed by Mr. Wager.

Supervisor Croce stated that it came out beautiful and it is a wonderful addition to be used by our community. He stated again that he would try to get something on the website.

Mrs. Morse stated that she had one more request. She stated that Mrs. Laskowsky would like to be on the Veterans Committee and she was asking the Town Board to appoint her. She has done a lot of work with the Committee.

\* Councilwoman Delgado made a motion to appoint Mrs. Annette Laskowsky to the Town of Plattekill Veteran's Committee.

Councilman Putnam seconded.

On the vote: all ayes.

Supervisor Croce stated that he would also like to thank Mr. Wager, his wife Dawn and the Highway employees for all the work they do in getting the Park set up for the fireworks event. A lot of work goes into it.

Supervisor Croce stated that he also wanted to thank the Southern Ulster Rotary and the Plattekill and Modena Fire Departments. Everyone involved does a wonderful job. He stated that this event continues to grow each year and we are starting to run out of room for parking cars! He stated that most of the vendors sold out of whatever they were selling and that is a very important part of this event. All our not-for-profit, Town Vendors use this event as their yearly fundraiser.

Mrs. Coppola stated that she heard comments about how reasonable the prices were for food and other items. People can afford to come and bring their families and have a good time.

Supervisor Croce stated that the Band was great too and they only charged us \$200.00. Mrs. Paroli donated her time.

Mrs. Figueroa stated that she thought the Fireworks Event was great and she wanted to invite everyone to the next event at the Park which will be the Plattekill Latino-American Heritage Day on Sunday, July 26, from 12 noon to 4:00 PM. She stated that she was on the phone today speaking with many not-for-profit groups to invite them to sell at this event. She wanted to make sure everyone knew that everyone is invited to attend and that they would be honoring three people who have served our community over the years; Ray Acevedo, Rosemary Medina and the Town Clerk, Barbara Dawes.

Mrs. Coppola stated that she wanted to make sure the Citizen of the Year applications are put on the website for this year. The award is usually made at Plattekill Day in September. She stated that there

are so many people who volunteer their time and we need people to nominate them so that we can honor them. She stated that she puts up fliers and leaves applications, but sadly she does not get much of a response. She stated that she will be visiting the Fire Departments this year to make sure they are aware that they can nominate someone.

Supervisor Croce suggested that she stop in the Town Hall to set up the new dates for taking nominations and for making up this year's fliers.

Mr. Wager stated that he also wanted to include thanking the Town Board for all that they do to make the Fireworks Event a success. He stated that Supervisor Croce, Councilman Farrelly and Councilman DePew stayed until 12:30 AM that night to make sure everyone made it safely out of the Park. And there was also help on Sunday morning to clean up the Park. There were 30 bags of garbage that were picked up by 12 noon and he wanted to include Chris Dawes and Boy Scout Dustin Obermeyer who joined in helping to pick up all the trash. Thanks to them and anyone else we may have missed by name. The help is definitely appreciated.

There were no further comments or questions from the public.

\* Supervisor Croce made a motion to close the Public Input section of the meeting at 8:26 PM.

Councilman DePew seconded.

On the vote: all ayes.

#### SECTION 1 – POLICE MONTHLY REPORT

Supervisor Croce stated that the Police Chief was away on vacation and we will obtain his report for the next Town Board Meeting.

#### SECTION 2 – DOG CONTROL MONTHLY REPORT

Supervisor Croce stated that he had not received this report as yet.

#### SECTION 3 – BUILDING DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT

Councilwoman Delgado read the first page of the Building Dept. Monthly Report for June 2015. The report stated that there were 29 permits issued, 11 violations issued, 90 inspections done including complaints, building, violations, fire safety, Certificates of Occupancy and Certificates of Compliance, 12 Certificates of Occupancy and Certificates of Compliance issued, 20 Complaints received and 14 Municipal Searches done. These numbers do not include returning phone calls and assisting residents with code, building permits and Zoning and Subdivision issues.

#### SECTION 4 – RECREATION DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT

Councilman Farrelly read the Recreation Dept. Monthly Report for July 2015. He read that the next "Plattekill Community Day at Rocking Horse Ranch" date was being worked on and should be in the later part of September. Currently it is scheduled for the day after Plattekill Day, but there is still a possibility it will be moved to a different day. This date should be finalized by the end of this month.

The report continued by saying that Ms. Doland was working on some fun activities for the children's area at Plattekill Day, Sept. 19<sup>th</sup>. He read that she was putting together a display board with pictures and information on Summer Camp. She will also have a sign up to be put on a mailing list for next year's Summer Camp.

Councilman Farrelly read about Summer Camp that is currently in session. The report stated that last year she was the Camp Director, but the staff and schedule were given to her already done. This year, since she is the Assistant Director, she was responsible for making up the schedule and hiring the staff. She stated that she has made some slight changes that have made a huge difference in how the camp is running. She stated that she held a staff meeting before camp even started and the staff and parents were given handbooks with all the necessary information to make this year's camp safe and fun. She stated that one of the changes was to meet the State mandate of staff to camper ratio. She stated that she and Christine are floaters and they help out the age groups when needed. She stated that she has about the same number of campers as last year, but 4 less staff members. She stated that she has also changed the camp schedule by adding a set day, once a week, to be at the Plattekill Elementary School. This change of scenery helps in many ways. The children like the different playground and they can use the gym for basketball. It is also easier to do crafts without the wind interfering at the Town Park. She stated that there were 4 scheduled pool days, 4 scheduled field trips and one day will be spent at Hurd's Farm where the parents can drop off their children and pick them up at that site. The report stated that there is usually a daily theme that incorporates at least three activities and they try to follow a basic schedule but are flexible based on moods, attendance and the weather. There are usually several activities going on at the same time and the child is allowed to choose what activity they would like to do.

Councilman Farrelly read that Ms. Doland finished her report by writing "It's been a great summer so far!"

Supervisor Croce stated that he has had two parents approach him to let him know that they felt the Camp was great this year. He stated that he was at the Camp for a short period of time the other day and everything seemed to be going well and the Campers were all involved and having a good time.

Councilwoman Delgado stated that her grand-daughter attends the Camp and she loves it.

Supervisor Croce stated that he was taking a fire truck to the Park tomorrow to set up a water sprayer so the children can run and play it. He stated that it was good to hear many positive comments about our Camp.

#### SECTION 5 – ASSESSOR MONTHLY REPORT

Councilman DePew read the Assessor's Dept. Monthly Report for June 2015. The report stated that there were 19 transfers, 3 foreclosures, 6 arm's length sales, 2 vacant property sales, 5 residential sales and 1 mobile home sale. The sale price of residential homes for June was \$366,800.00.

#### SECTION 6 – UCRRA CONTRACT AGREEMENT

Supervisor Croce explained that the Supervisors have been trying to come to some type of agreement with the UCRRA and they have not had many options. He stated that he has looked into many different scenarios and in the long run, staying with the UCRRA seems to be the best option, especially since our garbage has to be taken to them for processing.

Supervisor Croce read a letter from the UCRRA that stated effective July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015 the Towns will be charged an \$85.00 rental fee for the use of each box. He stated that we have 4 C&D boxes and this will be an increase to the Towns tipping fees, which are also going up. He stated that the Town Board will have to consider upping our fees to cover some of this increase. He stated that this fee will last for 5-years to cover the cost of replacing the old boxes.

The Town Board discussed using another company to supply the Town with boxes and to haul the garbage to the UCRRA in Kingston, but we would still have to pay the tipping fees to the UCRRA to take the garbage besides paying this other company. There was also some discussion on purchasing a compactor, but the Supervisor indicated that crushing the garbage in the boxes is now out-lawed and we would still have to pay by the weight of the container/box.

Supervisor Croce read another letter from the UCRRA in regards to the new agreement. We would not have to pay the \$85.00 on the recycle containers; we would just have to pay on the C&D containers.

Supervisor Croce stated that the Ulster County Supervisors have been working on this issue and agreement for quite a while. They feel the UCRRA was poorly operated in the past and they are trying to get the facility back on track.

Councilman Farrelly asked, so we have contacted other companies?

Supervisor Croce stated yes, but it is more expensive in the long run with other companies. He stated that we do have one other option and that is to close the facility.

The Town Board agreed that they did not want to close the facility.

\* Councilwoman Delgado made a motion to authorize the Supervisor to sign the 5-year agreement with the UCRRA to service our Town Transfer Station.

Councilman Putnam seconded.

On the vote: all ayes.

There was more discussion about where the UCRRA takes the garbage that they collect from the County. Most of it is taken to a landfill near Syracuse, NY.

Supervisor Croce stated that he tried to work with other Towns to try to use other companies and he could not work out a viable plan.

#### SECTION 7 – ULSTER COUNTY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM RESOLUTION

Supervisor Croce explained that the Town Board has to adopt a resolution to be part of the Ulster County Emergency Response Team (UCERT). He stated that this program was much like the Ulster Regional Gang Enforcement Narcotics Team (URGENT), but this team responds with a rapid tactical response to critical incidences and serves as a resource for the Town of Plattekill Police and law enforcement agencies within the County.

Supervisor Croce stated that he has discussed this agreement with the Chief of Police, Joe Ryan, and Lieutenant Smith, and they feel this is something we should be a part of.

\* On a motion by Councilman DePew and seconded by Councilman Putnam the Town Board adopted the following resolution:

**WHEREAS**, various town police departments in the County of Ulster, together with the Ulster County Sheriff’s Office and the SUNY New Paltz Campus Police Department, as Member Agencies, seek to cooperate and act collectively as an emergency response team, such task force known as the Ulster County Emergency Response Team (hereinafter referred to as “UCERT”), and

**WHEREAS**, the mission of UCERT is to achieve maximum coordination and cooperation, through utilizing the combined resources of Member Agencies, to support the various municipalities within the County of Ulster with a rapid tactical response to critical incidents, and

**WHEREAS**, membership in the UCERT task force will benefit the Town of Plattekill in that it will create a specialized unit to provide a rapid tactical response to critical incidents and serve as a resource for the Town of Plattekill police and law enforcement agencies within the County, and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board has reviewed the inter-municipal Cooperative Agreement (Ulster County Emergency Response Team) proposed by the Ulster County Sheriff, a copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part of this resolution, and

**WHEREAS**, the Police Chief of the Town of Plattekill has also reviewed the annexed inter-municipal Cooperative Agreement and has recommended that the Town Board approve the agreement,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that upon a motion by Councilman DePew and seconded by Councilman Putnam, the Town Board of the Town of Plattekill hereby approves the annexed agreement and membership in the task force, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Police Chief of the Town of Plattekill is authorized to execute the annexed agreement on behalf of the Town.

**SECTION 8 – SALT SHED REPAIRS – BID PACKAGES**

Supervisor Croce stated that Mr. Wager, Mr. Dougherty and he had reviewed the bid package information, with the Attorney, for fixing the Salt Shed. They also sent the information to the Insurance Company to obtain their input for the insurance needed in the package and he has just received their response today.

Mr. Wager stated that he would like to see this project move forward this evening and if the Town Board does approve it this evening, then the Town Clerk can put the ad in the newspaper and we can get the bid out and back in time to get this done before the snow flies.

Supervisor Croce stated that Mr. Wager and Mr. Dougherty did a lot of research on this project and he would like to see the Town Board move forward on this, this evening. He stated that they will just have to get the final information into the bid package and we will decide when the bids will be due back to the Town. Then the Town Clerk can put the ad in the newspaper.

\* Supervisor Croce made a motion to authorize the Town Clerk to advertise the bids for repairs to the Salt Shed.

Councilman Putnam seconded.

#### SECTION 9 – CIRCUS COMING TO TOWN – SEPT. 23,2015

Supervisor Croce stated that he wanted to let everyone know that he has confirmed with the Circus Company that they are coming to Town on Sept. 23, 2015. All the conditions and fees will be the same as last year and they will set up the tent in the same location as last year. He is expecting a contract to arrive in the mail.

#### SECTION 10 – VOUCHERS
